

PILOT RESOLUTION

A regular meeting of the County of Oswego Industrial Development Agency (the “*Agency*”) was convened in public session on September 30, 2009 at 4:00 p.m, at 44 West Bridge Street, Oswego, New York.

The meeting was called to order by the Chair and, upon the roll being duly called, the following members were:

The following resolution was duly offered and seconded:

RESOLUTION APPROVING A PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAX SCHEDULE AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF CERTAIN DOCUMENTS BY THE AGENCY IN CONNECTION WITH A CERTAIN PROJECT UNDERTAKEN AT THE REQUEST OF OTIS PRODUCTS, INC.

WHEREAS, the County of Oswego Industrial Development Agency (the “*Agency*”) is authorized and empowered by Title 1 of Article 18-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York (the “*State*”), as amended, together with Chapter 234 of the Laws of 1973 of the State of New York, as amended from time to time (collectively, the “*Act*”) to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of industrial, manufacturing, warehousing, commercial, research and recreation facilities, including industrial pollution control facilities, railroad facilities and certain horse racing facilities, for the purpose of promoting, attracting, encouraging and developing recreation and economically sound commerce and industry to advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State, to improve their recreation opportunities, prosperity and standard of living, and to prevent unemployment and economic deterioration; and

WHEREAS, to accomplish its stated purposes, the Agency is authorized and empowered under the Act to acquire, lease, and sell real property and grant financial assistance in connection with one or more “projects” (as defined in the Act); and

WHEREAS, Otis Products, Inc., a New York business corporation (the “*Company*”), submitted an application (the “*Application*”) to the Agency on or about August 26, 2009, a copy

of which is on file at the office of the Agency, requesting that the Agency undertake a project (the "**Project**") consisting of: (A) (i) the acquisition of a leasehold interest in approximately 4.35 acres of improved real property located at 20 County Route 59, Town of Schroepel, Oswego County (the "**Land**"); (ii) the renovation of an existing building for use as a research and development center and some manufacturing of metal components/injection moldings for use in gun cleaning systems and related accessories (collectively the "**Facility**"), all located on the Land; (iii) the acquisition of and installation in the Facility of various machinery, equipment and furnishings (collectively the "**Equipment**") (the Land, Facility and Equipment are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "**Project Facility**"); (B) the granting of certain financial assistance in the form of exemption from real property tax, mortgage recording tax, if any, and sales and use taxation (collectively, the "**Financial Assistance**"); and (C) the lease of the Project Facility by the Agency pursuant to a lease agreement and the sublease of the Project Facility back to the Company pursuant to a sublease agreement; and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2009 the Agency adopted a Resolution (the "**Inducement Resolution**") undertaking the Project and appointing the Company as its agent for purposes of completing the Project Facility; and

WHEREAS, on September 30, 2009 the Agency adopted a resolution determining that pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review that the Project constitutes an Type II Action requiring no further review under SEQRA (the "**SEQRA Resolution**");

WHEREAS, in the Application, the Company also requested that the Agency consider a payment in lieu of tax ("**PILOT**") schedule, more fully described on **Exhibit "A"** attached hereto.

WHEREAS, the Agency has given due consideration to the Application and to representations by the Company that the provision of Financial Assistance: (i) will induce the Company to develop the Project Facility in the Town of Schroepel, (ii) will not result in the removal of a commercial, industrial or manufacturing plant or facility of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project Facility from one area of the State to another area of the State or in the abandonment of one or more plants or facilities of the Company or any other proposed occupant of the Project Facility located in the State, except as may be permitted by the Act; and (iii) undertaking the Project will create and/or preserve permanent private sector jobs in the State;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the members of the County of Oswego Industrial Development Agency, as follows:

Section 1. It is the policy of the State to promote the economic welfare, recreation opportunities and prosperity of its inhabitants and to actively promote, attract, encourage and develop recreation and economically sound commerce and industry for the purpose of preventing unemployment and economic deterioration. It is among the purposes of the Agency to promote, develop, encourage and assist in the acquiring, constructing, reconstructing, improving, maintaining, equipping and furnishing of certain facilities, including commercial facilities, and thereby advance the job opportunities, health, general prosperity and economic welfare of the people of the State and to improve their recreation opportunities, prosperity and standard of living.

Section 2. The Agency ratifies all prior Resolutions passed in connection with this proposed Project.

Section 3. Based upon the representations made by the Company to the Agency, and the reasons presented by the Company in support of its request for the PILOT schedule and after consideration of correspondence and oral comments, if any, received, the PILOT schedule, attached hereto, is hereby approved.

Section 4. A copy of this Resolution shall be placed on file in the office of the Agency where the same shall be available for public inspection during business hours.

Section 5. The Secretary/Treasurer of the Agency is hereby authorized and directed to distribute copies of this Resolution to the Company and to do such further things or perform such acts as may be necessary or convenient to implement the provisions of this Resolution as well as all previously approved Resolutions.

Section 6. Counsel to the Agency and special Agency counsel are hereby authorized to work with the Company, and others to prepare, for submission to the Agency, all documents necessary to effect the grant of Financial Assistance.

Section 7. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.
